Ongoing Education - Potomac Valley Master Naturalists 1/17/2023

To be recertified annually a Master Naturalist must complete a minimum of 8 class hours of instruction and 16 hours of volunteer service between January 1 and December 31.

Advanced training should not repeat the same basic information on a subject that has already been covered in the initial training program. However, an advanced training opportunity that covers the subject in more depth or from a different perspective could qualify.

Advanced training may be provided by PVMN, other MN chapters in West Virginia, recognized environmental groups (e.g., Cape May Bird Observatory, Smithsonian Institute, NCTC) as well as other organizations.

In general, educational TV programs, movies, or videos on a natural history subject do not count as advanced training except when viewed as part of an approved lecture or workshop. Travel time to an advanced training event will not count toward hours.

Elective credits will be granted on an hour-for-hour basis. However, college or university classes, either undergraduate or graduate, will be limited to the number of credit hours.

This is not a complete list of everything available for advanced training hours. Email alerts are sent out when a continuing education opportunity arises. Many times, emails are sent about a live presentation or live webinar that is only available on a particular date/time.
